Students may receive immunization shots for the following:

Hepatitis B (\$121 each–series of 3 required), meningitis (\$146) , MMR (\$87), tetanus/pertussis (Tdap) (\$77), HPV (Gardasil) (\$150 each–series of 3 required), and Varicella (Chicken Pox) (\$128). All of the above mentioned vaccines are 100% covered by the UC health insurance plan. Proof of Hepatitis B vaccination for students younger than 19 years of age on 9/22/12 is the only vaccination required for enrollment. The other vaccinations are highly recommended by the CDC and the American College Health Association. To take full advantage of this clinic, please have your immunization records with you.
